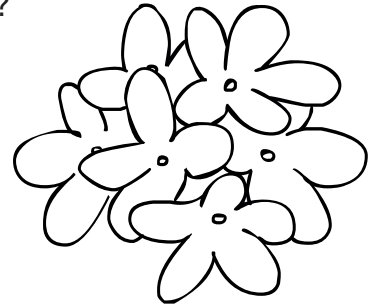

May Day



May Day, which is on May 1st, is a spring festival and a public holiday in many countries. The celebrations are different around the world.

In the USA, people hang May baskets on their neighbours' or friends' doorknob. May baskets are small baskets with flowers or sweets. There is no card inside, so people do not know who the basket is from.

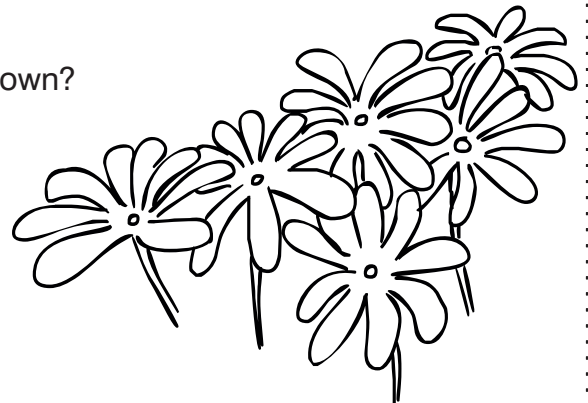
In Germany, on May Day or the night before, people put a maypole in the middle of their town. A maypole is a tree trunk which people decorate with colourful ribbons and flowers. Each town wants to have the prettiest maypole. In many places, people perform a special dance around the maypole.

French people give a bouquet of Lily of the Valley to their relatives and friends. Lily of the Valley is a plant with small white flowers, which look like little bells. It is a symbol of good luck. Families with children go to the forest and pick the flowers themselves. Other people buy the bouquets in the streets of their towns.

In Hawaii, May Day is called Lei Day. A lei is a traditional garland of flowers which people wear around their necks. It is a symbol of friendship. On May 1st people exchange lei and kiss each other.
